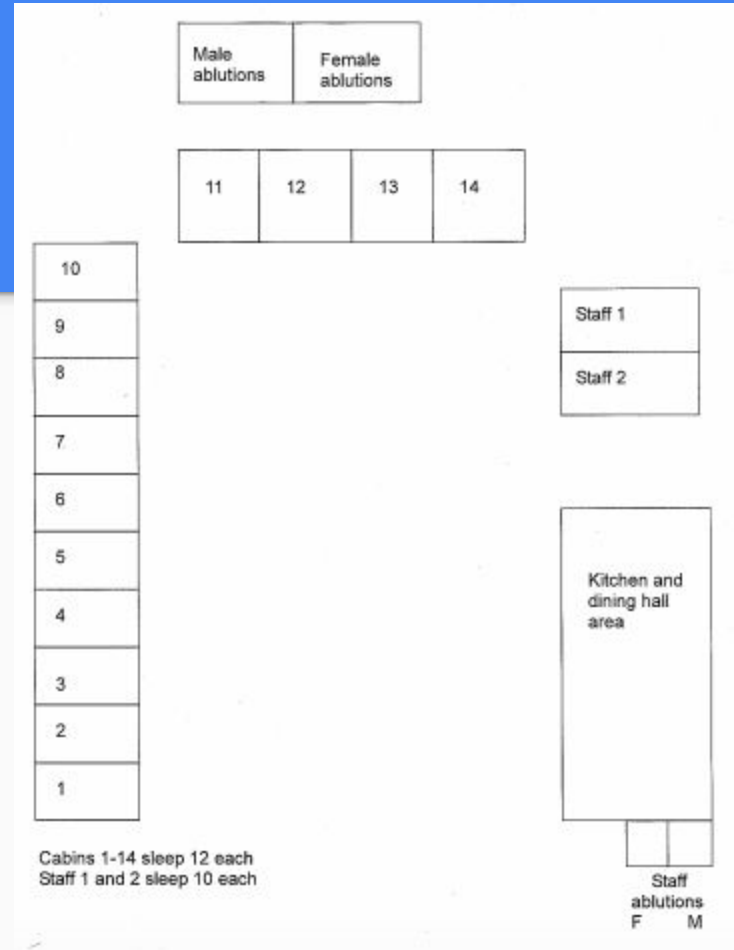
# Main Lodge

2 Cabins of 12 Students = 24 Students

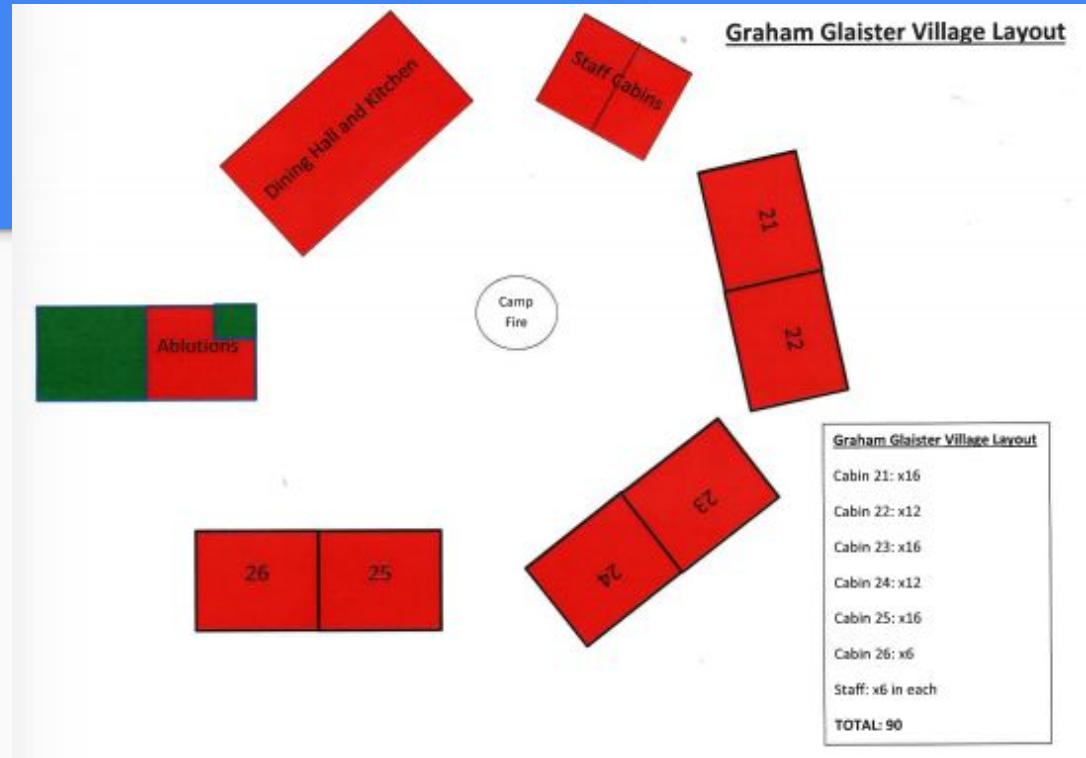
1 Cabin of 6 Students = 6 Students
